Ellen Terry showcases 1923 Italianate-style home on Swiss Avenue

Ellen Terry, one of the top-producing agents at Ellen Terry Realtors, is offering the home at 5007 Swiss Avenue in Dallas for \$995,000.

The residence, which features three bedrooms and 4½ baths, is located in one of the area's most desirable neighborhoods.

Architect Clarence Bulger built the home in 1923 for Mr. and Mrs. Wesley Porter Mason. Mr. Mason owned the Mason Engineering Co. Mrs. Mason played a prominent role in Dallas musical history, sponsoring tours of famous European musicians throughout the U.S. after World War I. Among those who toured were Ignace Paderwski, Fritz Kreisler, Jascha Heifetz, Van Cliburn and Sergei Rachmaninoff, who reportedly performed in the Mason's music room, according to the current owner. In 1983, the home was moved from Oran and Swiss streets to its present location.

"This is a special opportunity to own one of Swiss Avenue's premier properties with numerous amenities," Ms. Terry says. "It

Featuring a relaxed modification of the Italian Renaissance style, this home includes an asymmetrical hipped roof with a projecting wing and a bank of three windows topped with arches, a look that is repeated in the entrance and porte-cochere.

The home's interior is large. The grand living room opens on one end to a library/music

room, while the other end opens to a spacious dining room with French doors that lead to the large back yard and pool. Because of the size of the formal areas, as well as the gourmet kitchen, the home offers ideal locations for entertaining large groups or hosting intimate dinner parties. In addition, large bedrooms and sitting areas are situated to create seclusion.
